PRIVACY POLICY

The policy explains the personal information we collect and how it is used.

We collect your personal information when you make direct enquiries with us, when hire agreements are completed or when our website is visited.

How we use your information

This privacy policy outlines what to expect when we collect personal information. We do not share your personal information with third parties unless we have your consent or to comply with a legal obligation.

Contact with the Village Hall

When you contact the Village Hall we will obtain sufficient information to enable us to contact you. If you enter into a hire agreement with the Village Hall we will obtain sufficient information to enable us to identify you and your guests and to invoice you with costs involved. In line with legal regulations we keep booking paperwork for 6 years and then shred it.

Visitors to the Website

When someone visits the Stanwick Village Hall Website (www.Stanwickvillagehall.org), we collect standard internet log in information and details of the visitor behaviours patterns. We do this to find out things such as number of visitors to various parts of the site. We collect this information in a way that does not identify users personally. If for any reason we decide to collect more information on users, we will notify users prior to this occurring.

Cookies

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work more efficiently. They also provide statistical information to the owners of the site.



Use of Cookies by the web host provider

We use JOLT UK and Tapiochre Ltd to host and maintain our website. No cookies are used by these two organisations.

Use of Cookies by Stanwick Village hall

Cookies collect information about how visitors use a website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often. These cookies do not collect personal information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. It is only used to improve how a website works for example:

Remembering You: When you visit the website and if you must log in (normally related to administrative activities only), cookies help the website remember that you are logged in.

Preferences: Cookies can also remember your preferences, such as the page font size and how you prefer or the website to look for you.

Analytics: The website may use cookies to understand how you use the website; how you reached it and which pages you visited.

Security: Cookies play a key role in keeping the website secure.

Types of Cookie used:

Required Cookies

The Required or Functional cookies relate to the functionality of our website and allow us to improve the service we offer to you through our website, for example by allowing you to carry information across pages of our website to avoid you having to re-enter information, or by recognizing your preferences when you return to our website. These cookies cannot be disabled as doing so may affect the accessibility of the site for our visitors.

Analytical Cookies

Analytical cookies allow us to recognise and to count the number of visitors to our website, to see how visitors move around the website when they are using it and to record which content viewers view and are interested in. This helps us to determine how frequently particular pages and advertisements are visited and to determine the most popular areas of our website. This helps us to improve the service which we offer to you by helping us make sure our users are finding the information they are looking for, by providing anonymised demographic data to help target information more appropriately to you, and by tracking the success of any campaigns on our website. These cookies can be disabled by you as doing so will not affect the accessibility of the site.



Social Media Cookies

These cookies allow you to share website content with social media platforms (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Instagram). We have no control over these cookies as they are set by the social media platforms themselves but you can disable them for your own purposes and by you as doing so will not affect the accessibility of the site.

Targeted Advertising Cookies

Advertising and targeting cookies are used to deliver any adverts or popup banners we use over time so that they are more relevant to you, but the same cookies can also limit the number of times you see such data so the same information is not shown too frequently when you do not wish to see them. They can remember that you have visited a website, but this information is not shared with other organisations. These cookies can be disabled by you as doing so will not affect the accessibility of the site.
